# **A BILL FOR AN ACT**

#### 101 **CONCERNING ELECTRONIC VOTING BY CERTAIN ELECTORS WHO ARE**

102 ABSENT FROM THE STATE ON ELECTION DAY.

#### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Directs the secretary of state to promulgate rules that specify the procedures by which an absent uniformed services elector, a nonresident overseas elector, or a resident overseas elector may receive and return an absentee ballot by electronic means. Defines "electronic means" as facsimile transmission, but authorizes the secretary of state to establish procedures by which an absent uniformed services elector may vote by electronic mail.





Makes conforming amendments.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1.** 1-8-103.5 (1), (2), and (3), Colorado Revised 3 Statutes, are amended, and the said 1-8-103.5 is further amended BY 4 THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION, to read: 5 1-8-103.5. Voting by persons residing overseas and military 6 personnel - definitions. (1) The designated or coordinated election 7 official for OF a county or other political subdivision as applicable, that 8 meets the requirements specified in OF THE rules promulgated by the 9 secretary of state pursuant to subsection (3) of this section shall provide 10 an absentee ballot by electronic means to an eligible elector who: WHO 11 (a) is an absent uniformed services elector, a nonresident overseas 12 elector, or a resident overseas elector, as defined in section 1-2-208 (2.5), 13 and 14 (b) (Deleted by amendment, L. 2003, p. 1334, § 4, effective 15 August 6, 2003.) 16 (c) timely filed an absentee ballot application with the designated 17 or coordinated election official. 18 (2) (a) The eligible elector may return the voted ballot to the 19 designated or coordinated election official by electronic transfer. In order 20 to be counted, MEANS. The returned ballot shall be received COUNTED IF 21 IT ARRIVES in the office of the designated or coordinated election official 22 by 7 p.m. on election day. Once WHEN the ballot is received by the 23 designated or coordinated election official, a bipartisan team of judges 24 shall duplicate the ballot, and the ballot shall be counted as all other 25 absentee ballots. Duplicating THE judges WHO DUPLICATE THE BALLOT shall not reveal TO ANY OTHER PERSON how the elector has cast his or her
 ballot.

3 (b) Any elector who receives THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING
4 an absentee ballot pursuant to this section shall be informed in the
5 instructions for completing said ballot INFORM THE ELECTOR that the AN
6 ABSENTEE ballot RETURNED BY ELECTRONIC MEANS is not a confidential
7 ballot.

8 (c) In handling a returned ballot RETURNED pursuant to this 9 section, all reasonable means shall be taken to ensure that only the 10 receiving judge is JUDGES WHO RECEIVE AND DUPLICATE THE BALLOT ARE 11 aware of information connecting the elector to the returned ballot.

(3) The secretary of state may SHALL prescribe by rule any THE
procedures or requirements as may be necessary to implement the
provisions of this section. Such THE RULES SHALL SPECIFY THE
PROCEDURES FOR SENDING AND RETURNING A BALLOT BY ELECTRONIC
MEANS. THE rules shall be promulgated in accordance with article 4 of
title 24, C.R.S.

18 (4) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "ELECTRONIC MEANS" MEANS 19 FACSIMILE TRANSMISSION; EXCEPT THAT THE SECRETARY OF STATE MAY BY RULE PROMULGATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 4 OF TITLE 24, 20 21 C.R.S., ESTABLISH PROCEDURES BY WHICH A UNIFORMED SERVICES 22 ELECTOR <u>SERVING OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES</u>, <u>A VOLUNTEER SERVING</u> 23 IN THE PEACE CORPS, OR VOLUNTEERS FOR ANY MISSIONARY SERVICE MAY 24 RECEIVE AND RETURN A BALLOT BY ELECTRONIC MAIL IN SPECIFIED 25 CIRCUMSTANCES.

26 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
